SHORTAGE IS ACUTE.

Oregon Railroad Virtually Unable to Get Cars.

Although ever thing is being done that can be done by the Oregon railroad to relieve the congestion, the car shortage that has embarrassed shippers for the past few months has reached an acute stage. It is now worse than ever before and the situation is said by those in a position to know, to be the most damaging to business in the annals of Oregon railroading. Cars are well nigh impossible to secure. Business men interested in the moving of all kinds of freight are clamoring for cars, but to no purpose. No relief is in sight.

The wheat crop in the interior is waiting to be moved to Portland, where ships are being ready to take the grain to foreign ports. There are no cars available to transport this year's crop to tidewater and grain exporters are desperate. Sawmill men are ruin staring them in the face, for unless cars can be had to carry their products to market, shut-downs and heavy losses are unavoidable. Hop dealers are anxious to have their hops hauled East and merchants generally are at their wits' end for transportation.

The supply of cars is strikingly inadequate. There are two sources from which the Oregon lines of the Harriman system secure empty cars. These are the delivery of "empties" by the Southern Pacific at Ashland or by the Oregon Short Line at Huntington.
