 State Home for Consumptives.

While some opposition has been raised in different parts of the state against the proposed creation, at the coming session of the legislature, of a state consumptive home at Portland, the movement is generally regarded as a meritorious one, and local physicians express themselves as being in favor of such an enterprise. The chief motive for attack from some parts in the Willamette valley is that the institution will be merely a Portland project and that other towns and cities will not receive their proportionate benefits. Such a position is regarded as childish and members of the state boards of health are surprised to have opposition from such a source.

Robert C. Yennet, secretary of the state board, in commenting on the matter says: "The sole idea is to protect property at large against the consumptive, and to protect the consumptive against himself. As to its being a Portland institution from which Portland would derive all the benefits, that is ridiculous. The plan is for an extensive area, and such cannot be found in Portland."

Dr. C. J. Smith, a member of the state board, is an ardent supporter of the proposed measure and he will put forth his efforts in the coming session of the legislature to have it passed. He has recommended that such an institution be created, and believes that the location of the same should be at some point in eastern Oregon or in the central part of the state where rainfall is less than in Portland.

Nearly all the states in the union are taking up with the plan for consumptive farms. It is strictly sanitary and humanitarian and it is conceded that any opposition to the proposed home in this state is ill-timed, and the assertion that it will make Oregon a dumping ground for consumptives is unwarranted.

The matter is receiving some thought from local physicians, and it is their general opinion that such an institution should be established in the state regardless of the location of the same.

Boise Fuel Famine.

Boise, Nov. 16.—An evidence of the seriousness of the fuel situation in Boise is the fact that one of the coal firms, the Boise Commission company is 110 cars behind on orders. Furthermore, the orders for this coal were mostly placed during the first and the middle of the summer.

The company went to the expense of erecting bins to store 3000 tons and secured teams and wagons to deliver the coal and all are useless.

The company as a result of the reduction of freight rates on wood from Council, endeavored to contract for 2000 cords but was unable to secure any at all.

A large potato crop was raised around Weston this year, and there is a large demand for the crop. Weston potatoes having a peculiar flavor and being considered about the best raised in the Island Empire, hence they bring a higher price than other potatoes.

A Jackson county man packed 100 boxes of apples in five hours. Another packed 112 boxes in eight hours. Other records nearly as fast are reported. The price usually paid for packing is 5 cents a box. Shippers are discovering that the quality of the packing as well as the fruit costs a big figure nowadays.

Lewiston has been in darkness for several days owing to a breakdown in the steam plant of the Clarkston substation. No power has been had during the trouble and newspapers there have been handicapped in getting out their issues.

Sidney Sloan, murderer of his father, is on trial at Spokane. The entire week so far has been taken up in securing a jury.

The affairs of the Walla Walla penitentiary are being probed into by the state commission. The investigation has been going on all week.

Several towns in Washington report a coal oil famine as well as a shortage of coal. Candles are being used for illumination.
