REMEDY FOR CAR SHOR FAGE.

Large Shippers Meet in Chicago to Discuss Methods.

Chicago, Jan. 4 - A considerable number of the large shippers throughout the country, representing various industries gathered in Chicago today to discuss the car short-ge problem. The lumbermen's associations took the initiative in bringing them together to exchange ideas and to recommend informally some solution. The majority appear in favor of federal legislator penalizing the railroads for fulure to deliver cars requisitioned by shappers, after a reasonable time.

In calling the gathering to order the chairman explained the chief purpose of the present movement to be to secure the enactment of a federal law requiring the assessment and payment of recipio cal demorrage. Under such a law, the themselves would be penalized for failing to provide shippers with cars within a reasonable time after their requisition, just as the suppers are now penalized for failing to load cars de ivered within a reasonable time. The speakers explained that the present movement is not immical to the after the cutting and has not yet railroads themselves, but to the car service abuses which they have allowed to grow to such enormous proportions. For years the roads have enforced rules to exact demurrage from shippers for failuretal al cars within a reasonable time. This was generally recognized as just and calculated to secure prompt shipment and more satisfactory car beryice, and the right of the roads to exact demur age under resonable rules has seldom been questioned. But when the roads themselves fall to deliver ears requisitioned for leading, and when months by reason of the failure to place re-elected as follows: cars at the shippers' disposal, the chippers name by feel that the rule should work both ways and that the demarrage should be reciprocal.

The coal and lumber trades are leading the fight for recip scal demurrage. Present conditions in the lumber trade, especially in the south and west, are said to be deplorable. The car shortage problem is causing enormous financial tose to lumber manufacturers and the same applies to a greater or lesser degree to the coal, grain and other trades. Failure to make car deliveries has materially reduced the current receipts of the shippers, and man result some of the strongest concerns in the country have recently been compelled to borrow anoney at heavy interest to handle their payrolls and other obligations. Not only are the firms themselves affected, but their laborers are also sufferers that the total loss of time and mone_ s a direct result of the railroads to supply cars is incalculable.

GREAT STRIKE IMMINENT.

Employes of Railroads Demand Many Concessions.

Chicago, Jan. 4 .- One of the biggest railroad strik-s of the country, which would include nearly every line in the United States, Canada and Mexico, tie up transportation and throw hundreds of thousands of men out of work, was threatened today in a decision of the railroad labor leaders to press their demands for immediate concessions from the employers. Concerted action by the firemen, engineers and other employes of the roads will be taken to secure new agreements with the railroad officials, and, if these are not acceded to, a general strike, it is said.

The fresh demands follow negotiations between the roads avo and the switch and, who were granted an increase amounting to 13 per cent in conferences held in Chicago in November. Many roads throughout the country voluntarily raised the pay of their employes, and millions of dollars were added to the payrolls of the road were added to the payrolls of the road. and the switche an, who were granted by the additional advances in wages.

Agitation for the eight hour day, was understood, was to be left to futurdiscussion. The system, it was deciar ed, would prove impossible of enforcement under present conditions. This fresh demand for it has caused great surprise, as the managers of many roads considered the fact understood by the men. The case of the Southern Pacific firemen, who are out on strike, was mentioned in the argument. It was also said that the situation regarding the Burlington and the Rock Island roads was acute, and that labor committee are at present waiting on the managers of the two systems with requests for an amelioration of conditions.
