ANOTHER BIG LAND GRANT

Northern Pacific Railroad
Gobbles More Land.
50,000 ACRES IN MORROW

Within the Past Seven Months the
Company has Filed Patents
for Over 75,000 Acres.

The Northern Pacific railroad
since the 13th of July of last year
has filed government patents for
75,167 acres of land in Morrow,
Umatilla and Gilliam counties.

The land is covered by three
patents which are now on record
in the office of the county clerk.

The first patent for 32,575 acres
was filed on the 13th of July of
last year.

On September 10 of the same
year a patent was filed for 1852
acres.

The last patent covering 40,760
acres was made a matter of record
on the 26th of January of this
year.

About 50,000 acres of this land
is in Morrow county.

Assessor Connor has been en-
gaged this week in determining
the exact number of acres in this
county for assessment.

BIG LOSS OF SHEEP BY HIGH WATER

Caught on Bottoms of Lower Wil-
low Creek and Washed
Away.

A Smythe & Son lost 2200 head
of sheep on Willow creek about
three miles south of Heppner
Junction, Thursday evening of last
week.

The sheep were being camped
on the creek bottom and were
caught by high water caused by
melting snow.

The loss is in the neighborhood
of \$12,000.

ONLY TWO TRAINS THIS WEEK

Washouts on Both the Main
Line and Branch.

THE MAILS ARE DELAYED

It Will be Several Days Before
Trains are Running on
Schedule Time.)

The storm of the past week has
been a bad one on the railroads.
The last train bring mail from
Portland came up Saturday even-
ing and Tuesday all O. R. & N.
trains were out of commission
on the main line caused by wash-
outs and land slides.

The Heppner branch train suc-
ceeded in making regular trips un-
til yesterday when a bridge across
Willow creek near Cecil went out,

and the branch is tied up.
Business generally is seriously
affected.

Senator Laycock, has introduced
a bill for the creating of Clark
county to be composed of territory
now included in Northern Grant
county. The new officers of the
county are to be appointed by the
governor and serve until the next
general election. Long creek is to
be the county seat.
