IS BRIGHTJohn Flemming Anticipates Era of

men for Year 1907.John Flemming, the well known

Forsythe, Montana, was an incom-

has just sold 10,000 Oregon year-

enne, Wyoming, for \$4.00 per

purchased 6,000 head of sheep,

bought 192,000 head of sheep. Of
this number 115,000 head will be
shipped out of Heppner.Mr. Flemming is of the opinion
that the sheep market for 1907.
will be a record breaker. Pros-

perity for the sheepmen," said Mr.
Flemming."In speaking for the firm," con-
tinued Mr. Flemming, "we cer-
