## COUNTY COURT PROCEEDINGS

The Session Was a Short One—  
Usual Number of Bills  
Audited.

The regular session of county  
court was convened at the court  
house, Wednesday of last week  
with a full board of commissioners  
present.

The meeting was unusually  
short, the attention of the court  
only being occupied for two days  
in transacting the business.

The appointment of Benj. V.  
Pompella, of Irrigon, by Sheriff  
Shutt, as deputy sheriff, with full  
powers and without compensation  
except fees earned, was approved.

The reports of Scott Osborn as  
supervisor of road district No. 5,  
and T. W. Atkinson as supervisor  
of district No. 11, were accepted.

The sum of \$50 was appropri-  
ated to replenish the emergency  
fund.

The resignation of D. V. S. Reid  
as deputy surveyor was accepted  
by the court.

The resignation of S. P. Devin  
as road master was accepted.

The balance sheet of the clerk  
showing the cash balance in the  
several funds, after proper exam-  
ination of the books, was accepted.  
It was ordered that the clerk and  
treasurer be required to furnish  
similar balance sheets at each term  
in the future.

In the matter of the petition of  
R. M. Akers and others for county  
road. Accepted. John W. Brown  
and W. O. Minor were appointed  
viewers to meet with County Sur-  
veyor V. H. Heath, at the begin-  
ning point of said road on Thurs-  
day, March 14, to survey the road  
and make a report of their delib-  
erations at the next regular meet-  
ing of the court.

In the matter of the petition of  
D. S. Barlow and others for county  
road. Accepted. John W. Brown  
and W. O. Minor were appointed  
to meet with the county surveyor  
at the starting point of the pro-  
posed road, on Friday, March 15,  
to survey and view the road and  
report at the next meeting of the  
court.

In the matter of the survey of  
the Minor-Dutton road. The find-  
ings of the court were that the  
opening of this road would be a  
great advantage to a large num-  
ber of persons, and a more direct  
and easy route for freighters and  
farmers hauling to the warehouses  
of Heppner, it was ordered that  
upon delivery to Morrow county of  
a duly executed deed for right of  
way of this road, and also the  
opening of this road, inside the  
city limits, by the city of Hepp-  
ner, that Morrow county will fence  
said road with a five wire fence  
with posts one rod apart.

The following road supervisors  
were appointed to fill vacancies  
caused by the failure of appointees  
at the January term to qualify:  
District No. 9, Walter Cason; No.  
7, J. H. Allen; No. 14, J. T. Ayers.  
John W. Brown was appointed  
county road viewer to fill the va-  
cancy caused by the resignation of  
J. C. Kirk.

Owing to the resignation of S.  
P. Devin as county road master, it  
was ordered that the county Judge  
and commissioners take charge of  
certain districts, as follows: Com-  
missioner Griffin, road districts  
7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 16. Commis-  
sioner McCarty, districts No. 3,  
12, 14. Judge Ayers, districts No.  
1, 2, 4, 5 and 6.

The appointment of Chas. O.  
Conner and S. E. Willis, by As-

essor Conner, as deputy assessors  
for Morrow county field work, ap-  
proved. The deputies will be al-  
lowed \$4 per day while actually  
engaged in field work.

The report of G. B. Alley, the  
expert employed to check up the  
1905 tax roll, was accepted.

The salary of the deputy sheriff  
was raised from \$60 to \$75 per  
month.
