Everything looks good — especially the weather.

Heppner's Fourth of July celebration will be a big one.

Heppner people now butter their bread with a Morrow county product, and there is no better butter on earth than is made at Lexington.

The visit of Portland business men to Heppner will result in good. Such visits cannot help but bring interests in closer touch with a better understanding of conditions. Portland people were not backward in making Heppner feel that they were ready to help us in any proposition that comes up where it is possible, and the influence of a great city is certainly something that can be of great value.

It would seem that Morrow county farmers have a just grievance in petitioning the Oregon Railroad Commission for a reduction in freight rates on wheat between Heppner and way points in this county and Portland. The farmers and everybody else as far as that is concerned cannot see why it would cost the O. R. & N. company two and three quarter cents more per hundred weight to haul wheat from Heppner to Portland a distance of 198 miles than it does from Pendleton, a distance of 231 miles. Morrow county's wheat crop will be at least 1,000,000 bushels and this excessive rate makes a difference worth looking after.

HIGH PRICES FOR WHEAT.

Tuesday's dispatches in relation to the conditions governing the wheat crop at the present time is a matter of much interest not only to the farmers but everybody.

Monday morning was the most sensational opening in the history of the Chicago Board of Trade. Gloomy crop prospects from almost every wheat producing country was the cause of the high offerings. There was a tremendous rush to buy wheat and the price soared above the dollar mark. Even a dollar and a half a bushel was talked of.

The net advance Monday for wheat was 4 cents for July and September options and 4½c for the December option. From the low point of Monday a week ago, July wheat has advanced 14½c, September has gone up 15½c, and December option, the higher point of the day, was 16½c above the low price of a week ago.

While such a spasmodic jump can be attributed in a measure to temporary excitement, still the conditions as indicated by the dispatches warrant the foundation for belief that future offerings for the coming crop will be high.

The reports state further that there were no claims in any direction that the market was being manipulated. The general opinion seems to be that the advance was based upon natural conditions, which are certain to curtail in large degree the world's coming crop of wheat. The advices from all parts of the West and Northwest confirmed the previous reports of damage by weather and by insects, while telegrams from the Canadian Northwest declared that there was still no possibility of seeding in the district and that every delay meant the loss of thousands of acres that might otherwise have been sown to wheat.

Cablegrams reported the market at Liverpool and Budapest to be in a highly excited condition, with prices advancing strongly. Liver-

pool was declared to be affected by the gloomy reports from Russia, and it was the belief of many prominent commission men that Europe will be forced to buy heavily in the American market, and that the American market, instead of being able to meet this demand, will be scarcely strong enough to supply such wheat as is needed for her own consumption.

Morrow county's prospects were never better for wheat. A dollar a bushel will mean \$1,000,000 for Morrow county farmers.
