**RAILROAD COMMISSION CONVENES**

**Witnesses Called From Neighboring Towns.**

The first meeting of the Oregon Railroad commission ever held in Eastern Oregon convened in the parlors of the Pendleton Commercial association Tuesday morning to hear the discussion of the matter of placing a local train in service on the O. R. & N. between Pendleton and Portland.

All the railroad commissioners, including President Thomas K. Campbell, Oswald West and Clyde B. Aitchison and Secretary George O. Goodall were present and were represented in the investigation by District Attorney G. W. Phelps and Judge S. A. Lowell.

Witnesses were called from Pendleton, Echo and Hermiston to testify to the crowded condition of the trains now running.

Dr. E. A. Mann of Condon told of long waits which are often necessary and of inconveniences suffered by the people on the Condon branch because of the inadequacy of the present service.

S. E. Notson, who represented the Commercial club of this city, presented a petition from Morrow county citizens asking for improved train service and also a reduction in freight rates.

Mr. Notson gave details of the inconveniences of the present mixed train service and also told of the unsatisfactory connections with main line trains by which it is often necessary to go to Heppner Junction a day in advance to get a train to Portland if a pressing engagement calls the passenger to the metropolis.
