OF INTEREST TO HUNTERS.

Synopsis of the New Oregon Game Laws.

The open seasons when various kinds of game may be killed in the different counties of Oregon are as follows:

Buck deer—In all counties except Baker, Coos, Curry, Grant, Harney, Malheur, Umatilla, Union and Wallowa, July 15 to November 1.

Female deer—In all counties except those named above, September 1 to November 1.

Deer—In Baker, Grant, Harney and Malheur, October 1 to 15.

Elk—September 15 to October 15.

Upland birds—China pheasants, native pheasants, grouse and quail, October 1 to December 1.

Blue grouse—East of Cascade mountains, August 15 to December 1.

Prairie chickens—In Wasco county, August 1 to October 15.

Ducks, geese and swans—In all counties except Coos and Lake, September 1 to January 1.

BAG LIMIT.

Ducks—50 in one week.
Geese and swans—No limit.
Upland birds—Ten in one day.
Deer—Five in one season.
Elk—One in one season.

ALWAYS UNLAWFUL.

To sell, offer for sale, barter or exchange, ship, carry or transport beyond the boundaries of this state, any deer, moose, mountain sheep, elk, silver-gray squirrel, swan, prairie chicken, grouse, and all species of upland birds and ducks.

To hunt without a license; to kill beaver or spotted fawn; to run deer with dogs or hunt at night; to kill China pheasants in Jackson county; to kill female deer in Coos and Curry counties; to kill quail or Mongolian pheasants in Grant, Harney, Gilham, Umatilla and Wheeler counties before January 1, 1912.

To trap or destroy nests of protected game birds.
To shoot on enclosed lands without permission.
To ship or sell deer skins without being properly tagged.

PENALTIES.

Fine to transport game outside of Oregon for sale, etc, \$100 to \$500.

Fine for violation of game laws, \$15 to \$500.

Fine to hunt without license, \$25 to \$100 and imprisonment.

OTHER INFORMATION.

For deer tags apply to any justice of the peace or county clerk. A hunter's license, secured in any county is good in all other counties of the state.
No license is necessary to hunt upon your own premises.
