Mrs. Halstead of Echo, while camping at Ditch creek underwent experience last Sunday that she will not forget soon.

Starting out at 7 o'clock in the morning Mrs. Halstead with a pail in hand was looking for huckleberries. In looking for the delicious fruit, she lost her bearings and became lost.

Not returning at the proper time the campers became alarmed and a search party consisting of John Rasmus, Orve Rasmus, Wm. Ball and Wm. Ayers, was organized and started at 7 o'clock in the evening in search of the missing woman. The party traveled until 11 o'clock at night. At the head of Capplinger canyon about four miles from Ditch creek, the woman was found sitting on a log, having screamed in response to calls of the searching party.

Mrs. Halstead was badly scared and excited and could hardly be induced to turn back, firmly believing that she was going in the right direction.
