The Heppner Commercial and Athletic Clubs have now opened up and will soon be in good working order.

During the hot season and when everything was very quiet, the club building was closed.

A good sized crowd of Heppner business men and young men interested in athletic sports met at the club rooms last Friday evening and the campaign for the winter was discussed.

The meeting was called to order by President Gilliam. Owing to the absence of Wm. Bennett, the former secretary who has gone to Baker City, Treasurer Huelat acted as secretary.

The vacancy in the secretary's office was filled by electing Morris Smead to fill the office of secretary.

A motion by R. F. Hynd to remit dues for the months of July and August, and that the secretary be instructed to collect dues commencing September 1, was carried.

Dr. Winnard stated that he conferred with Leo Grant, an instructor in athletic sports in relation to securing an instructor for the athletic club. Mr. Grant was present and stated that he would like to take hold and do what he could in helping to make the club a success as well as giving his best efforts in teaching. Mr. Grant in addition to a salary that could be agreed upon asked permission to give special training for which he could charge for.

E. L. Freeland moved that the building committee be instructed to provide seats for the athletic room on the first floor of the building. Carried.

By motion the secretary was allowed 10 per cent of the money collected on dues for his labor.

The meeting adjourned to meet again Tuesday evening.

At Tuesday's meeting Leo Grant was employed as physical culture instructor for the athletic club.

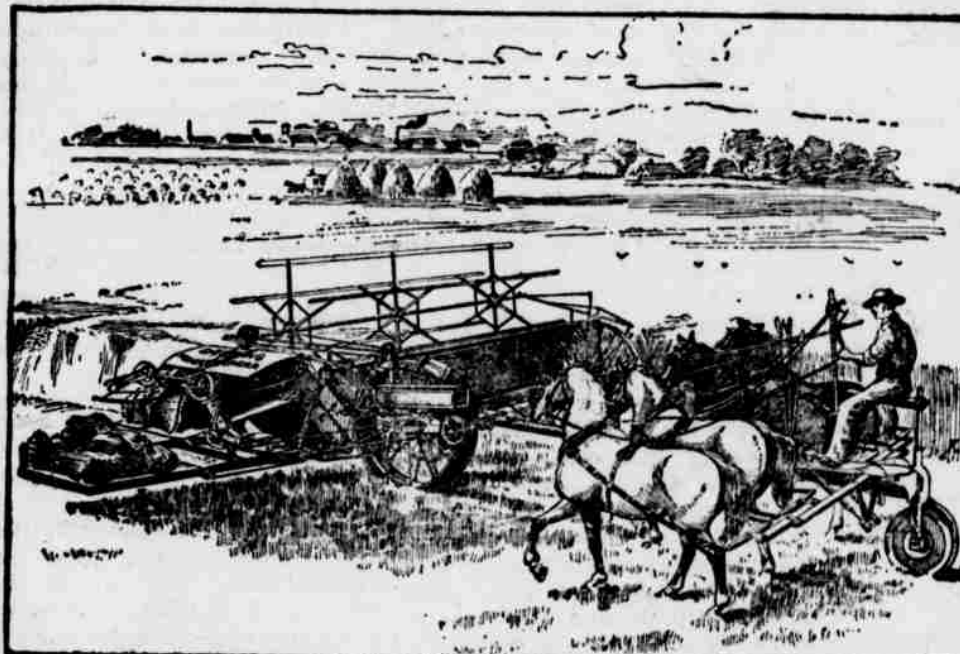
