RAILROAD REGULATION.

The Timberman, of Portland, is making an active interest in the matter of railroad regulation. In speaking of this important question the Timberman says:

Reasonable railroad regulation is the imperative demand of the hour. The subject is occupying the best minds of the nation. Upon its satisfactory solution depends the permanent prosperity, not only Oregon, but every other state in the Union. It would seem as if we were drifting towards government ownership or an enlargement of the powers of the Interstate Commerce Commission in the matter of fixing and determining equitable rates of transportation.

Under the provisions of the Dominion Railway Act of Canada the Railway Commission has absolute jurisdiction over the imposition of all railroad rates. The rate can be promulgated or become effective without first receiving the sanction and approval of the commission.

In the United States when a railroad company desires to change a tariff, it is compelled by law to simply file the proposed tariff for thirty days prior to its date of its becoming effective. If the rate is one which seriously jeopardizes the rights of the shippers who are unfortunate enough to be located along the line of the road, the remedy for the aggrieved parties is to file a complaint before the Interstate Commerce Commission, and ask for a hearing which usually takes months to secure. In the meantime, the rate goes into effect and irreparable damage may be inflicted.

Let Congress pass an amendment to the present Interstate Commerce Commission Act requiring all railroads to not only file their proposed freight tariffs with the Commission, but in addition must secure the consent of the Interstate Commerce Commission before the rates can become effective. In addition to taking any proposed change in their freight tariffs, the railroad companies should be compelled by law to advise the shippers tributary to their lines, ten or 60 or 90 days in advance, that an application would be made in the Interstate Commerce Commission asking for a hearing on the question of a change of rate.

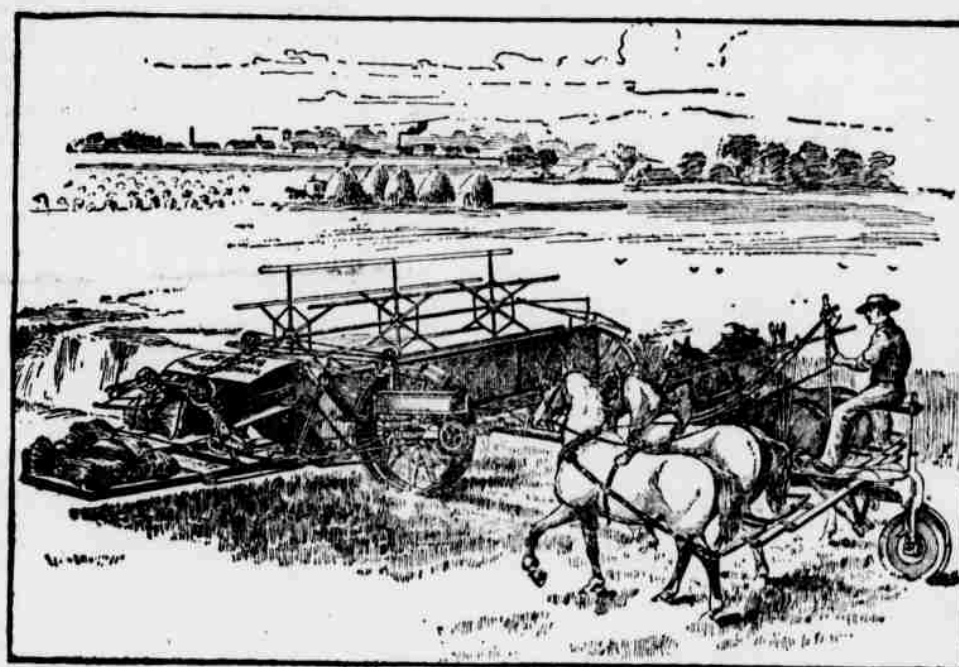
