A stock of alfalfa put up damp near Priceville burned spontaneously.

Recently some men at Kings Valley, Benton county, burned some slashings spread and burned eight or 10 miles of fence, three cows, five or six sheep and \$1,000 worth of sawlogs, altogether about \$2,500 worth of property.

The coroner has erected a monument over the grave of Joe Champion, the first white settler in Tillamook county, in the Oddfellows' cemetery. A public subscription was taken up for the monument, which is in white metal.
