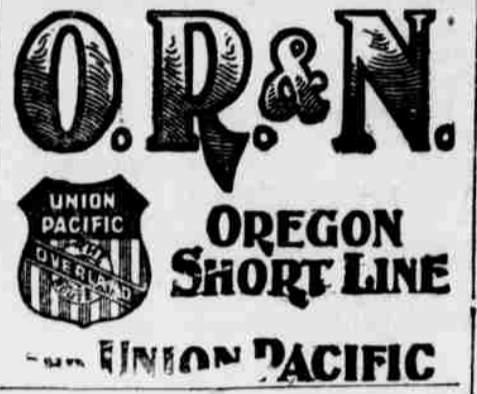

County Court.

The regular session of county court, after missing the regular meeting in November on account of the holidays, was convened at the court house Wednesday of last week, with a full board present.

The clerk was ordered to issue a warrant directing the sheriff to collect the delinquent taxes as shown on the 1906 tax roll.

Six new road districts were ordered in accordance with plat now on file with the county clerk.

The colonist rates, which resulted in bringing such a vast immigration to Oregon during September and October, 1907, will be in effect for March and April of 1908. The rate applies on all railroads, to all rail points in Oregon, on the same basis as before—\$25 from Kansas City, Minneapolis, and Duluth; \$30 from St. Louis; \$33 from Chicago; \$50 from New York. The fare is \$2.50 less on each ticket sold to a point east of Umatilla. An effort will be made by all the commercial bodies throughout the state of Oregon to make these two months add 20,000 to the population of the state.

Secretary of State Benson's report just issued shows the total area of National forests in Oregon to be 16,463,534 acres. The total amount received from forest reserve rentals for the year 1907 amounted to \$13,980.80. Morrow county's apportionment with 152,975 acres was \$129.91. Crook county leads in acreage 1,674,760 acres with an apportionment of \$1,422.21.

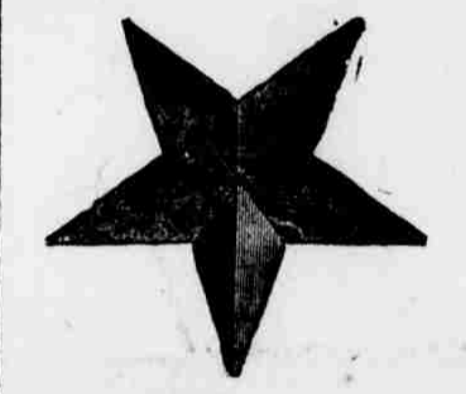
