Secretary of State Benson has completed the tabulated statement of the apportionment of state taxes among the various counties for the year 1908. Morrow county will pay for state purposes \$10,925. This amount is an increase of \$118 over last year.

The first concrete dam to be built on Willow creek to store water for irrigation purposes has just been finished in joint ownership by L. E. McBae, W. B. Ewing and Dr. Kistner. The dam is a substantial concrete structure, 70 feet in length. The abutments for the headgates are three feet square and rest on bedrock. The mouth of the ditch opening is 10 feet in the clear. About 350 acres will be irrigated from this dam.
