The following letter received this week by W. B. Barrett will be interesting news to the stockmen of Morrow and adjoining counties:

Portland, Oregon,
June 1st, 1908.

Mr. W. B. Barratt,
Heppner, Oregon.

My Dear Mr. Barratt,

Referring to my recent conversation with you in Heppner, I presume Mr. Huddleston has advised you of my telegram to him to the effect that rate of 50 cents per 100 lbs. would be established on salt in carloads from Utah producing points to Heppner to take effect as soon as the tariffs can be published. The same figure will also apply to Condon and Shaniko.

SALES OF WOOL

HIGHEST PRICES PAID AT HEPPNER.

No Offers Made on the Heavier Grades Put up.

Eleven buyers attended the wool sales in this city last Friday.

About 1,500,000 pounds of wool were sold, the prices ranging higher than at any sales in Eastern Oregon this season.

The Penland Land & Livestock company topped the market with 160,000 pounds at 14 5-8 cents per pound.

200,000 pounds rejected.

Salem Councilman Shot.

Salem, Or., June 2.—City councilman J. F. Goode was shot and seriously wounded about 10 o'clock this evening by Ben Stanton, a young man who, while under the influence of liquor, sought to force his attentions upon Goode's daughter, and granddaughter. Goode will probably recover, though shot through the back, the left hand and through the face.

Stanton, several years ago, waited upon Goode's granddaughter, now Mrs. Joe Reese, of Heppner. Mrs. Reese recently came to Salem to visit, and tonight attended the Vandette Theater, where she met her aunt, one of Goode's daughters, and the two went home together. They passed Stanton, spoke to him and proceeded home.

Stanton followed and entered the house, Miss Goode told him to go away, but he refused, insisting upon seeing Mrs. Reese, who had gone upstairs. When Miss Goode tried to telephone for an officer, Stanton drew a revolver and threatened to shoot her. Mr. Goode, who was in a rear room, slipped out of a back door to call an officer. Stanton heard him leave and ordered Miss Goode to call him back. After some delay she called, but he didn't respond, and Stanton started after him.

At Grange Hall, corner of Center and Commercial streets, Stanton found Goode at the telephone and shot him three times, the bullets taking effect as above stated. Stanton fled and has not been captured. Mr. Goode fell to the floor and was taken home, where Dr. Morse attended him.

Stanton is a young man of idle habits and evil reputation, but was not considered desperate. His crime was probably due to his being under the influence of liquor.
