Arrangements have been made for the various western delegations to meet the board of trade, prominent bankers and railroad men of Chicago at a luncheon there Friday afternoon, and it is expected as a result of this meeting a wool storage warehouse will be erected at once in the windy city similar to that just completed in Omaha through the efforts of Wyoming woolgrowers.

The capacity of the Omaha etorage house, it is thought, will be severely tested this season, and one twice as large is proposed for Chicago. Secretary Ballantyne is an enthusiast on this latest attempt of western woolgrowers to escape the middleman's profit, and says that a majority of Idaho sheepmen, now that they fully understand the plan, are anzious to see the Chicago project materialize.

According to reports received the establishment of the Omaha wool storage warehouse has had an appreciable effect on the industry in Wyoming. Eastern wool buyers are becoming more numerous but very few sales are made, and wools, especially from the central part of the state, are being moved to Omaha as rapidly as the weather will permit of shearing and loading.

The Omaha banks have announced they are in a position to make liberal loans on warehouse certificates. With the low prices offered for wool by the eastern buyers now iu Wyoming, growers feel they are taking no chances by shipping to Omaha, where it is said some of the larger manufacturers of the east have already made arrangements to place orders as soon as their clips are in.
