## 900,000 BUSHELS WILL BE MORROW'S WHEAT CROP.

### Market Starts off at 70c for Club and 74c for Blue Stem.

"I would place Morrow county's wheat crop at 900,000 bushels this season," said a prominent wheat buyer to a Gazette representative this week when asked for an estimate.

The buyer above referred to is a heavy dealer in cereals and naturally has been keeping close tabs on conditions in all of the wheat growing districts of this county.

The market starts off in good shape. Already buyers are in the field and offers of 70 cents per bushel for club with a premium of two cents for 40-fold and four cents for blue stem are being freely made.

This is the first year that Morrow county farmers have given 40-fold wheat a thorough trial. This new variety has been sown heretofore only in small lots owing to the fact that seed was hard to get, however the results were very satisfactory.

While this season has been very dry and is an off year, the results with a good sized acreage of 40-fold are met with much favor and this variety will no doubt take the lead in the future.

The advantages claimed are that 40-fold is earlier to mature, commands a better price than club, being a good milling wheat, and yields heavier than any other variety.

The main objection to 40-fold is the fact that it shatters more than other varieties.

Harvest is now well started all over the county. While the yield is light, there will be many fields with good yields. A few fields in Eight Mile will go from 25 to 30 bushels to the acre.

Winnard Bros' wheat which is being harvested with a combine is going 20 bushels to the acre.

Heppner warehousemen report that the demand for sacks is earlier this season than usual.

The mill crew was awakened at about 11 o'clock at night by the fire, which was already beyond control.

It is not known how the fire got started. Everything being very dry the flames spread rapidly to the lumber yard. Everything about the mill including all the lumber in the yard was completely destroyed.

Judge Patterson's decision returned the custody of the child to the father and the case was dismissed.

### COWS FOR DAIRY

#### R. F. WIGGELSWORTH BUYS CHOICE LOT.

### All Grade Jerseys With Good Records for Milk.

R. F. Wiggelsworth, the Butter creek stockman returned Saturday evening from Western Oregon where he had been to buy dairy cows.

"Now that the reserves policy is entering us down on summer range, and I have more hay than needed for the amount of sheep I am allowed to run, I have decided to try the dairy business," said Mr. Wiggelsworth.

Mr. Wiggelsworth has been a very successful stockman and he proposes to start in right in the dairy business.

His first purchase was 26 head of graded Jersey cows at an average cost of \$57.50 per head. He also purchased a registered bull at a cost of \$100.

The cows are a choice lot of dairy animals, the lot averaging 325 pounds of butter each for one year. One of his cows has a record of 410 pounds of butter for a year.

Mr. Wiggelsworth expects to increase his dairy herd to 50 cows within a year. He has purchased a new cream separator with a capacity of 900 pounds per hour.

Mr. Wiggelsworth will market his butter fat at Echo.
