The weight of the car is 1,500 pounds and its equipment includes two acetylene gas lamps, with

generator, three oil lamps, horn and kit of tools. In fact it is in every way a complete, high quality machine ready for use with all its parts direct from the factory for \$1,400.

In appearance this latest production in the automobile world has all the beauty of line and smoothness of finish of the standard cars, and with its great combination of improvements, good workmanship and low prices seems destined to fill the long standing demand for a high grade car at a moderate price. A feature that will be much appreciated by purchasers of the E. M.
