### IMPRESSIVE SERVICE

#### ELKS HOLD ANNUAL LODGE OF SORROW

#### Large Crowd Attended Memorial Services Sunday Afternoon.

At two o'clock p. m. last Sunday afternoon in the lodge room the local order of Elks held their annual lodge of sorrow.

### BIG REAL ESTATE DEAL

#### W. P. Dutton Sells Alfalfa Lawn Dairy to Wightman Brothers.

W. P. Dutton has sold the Alfalfa Lawn Dairy and the farm upon which it is conducted. Robert, Peter, and John Wightman are the purchasers and will continue to conduct the dairy as heretofore.

This is beyond a doubt the finest plant in Morrow county. It is close to the market, being only two miles below Heppner on Willow creek and the O. P. & N. railroad. There is something over a hundred acres of alfalfa and several hundred acres of the best of wheat land. The deal will consume 1580 acres, all in one body, and is known as the Dutton home ranch. The land and cattle, together with the horses and farm equipment, make close to a \$35,000 transaction and is considered by all to be one of the best buys made in real estate this season.

Mr. Dutton is an old pioneer of Morrow county and resided on this farm for over 19 years and made it one of the best places in Eastern Oregon. For years he ran sheep, but of late years he has drifted into diversified farming, feeding sheep through the winter, dairying and raising wheat. He, with his wife, has now moved into town to enjoy life in their beautiful home in the west side of our city.

Judge Dutton is one of the few men of this county who has seen fit to stay with his county and town. He has built several beautiful residences in the Halleck addition to the city and is investing his money in Morrow county property.

What Heppner and Morrow county need is more men like Judge Dutton. He made his money here and here is where he is going to spend it.

### School Notes.

Last Thursday, the writer visited the school in District No. 2. Miss Winifred Osten is the teacher of this school. The building is old and not very comfortable, but we understand that there is a prospect of a new building in the near future. The furniture is very good; the blackboard is good and there is ample blackboard space. The school is provided with several maps a set of charts, a globe, a splendid planetarium, a dictionary, and quite a number of library books. A good bookcase is provided for the books. There are eleven pupils enrolled, and all seem to be interested in their work.

On Friday, I visited the school at Gardane, Joint District No. 33. Miss Grace Edwards teaches this school. There are 17 pupils enrolled. The blackboard is excellent, and there is a fair amount of blackboard space. The furniture is first class. There are a few maps, a globe, a set of charts, and a few library books. There are good shades for the windows. A new stove is needed. The walls are appropriately decorated with well selected pictures. The pupils are enthusiastic in their work. The ozone of the mountain air seems to fill these pupils with an abundance of energy.

The pie social given by the teacher and pupils of School District No. 27, of which I made mention some time ago, netted about \$50.00. This will be used in repairing the school house and purchasing some new desks.

The school in District No. 17 has been furnished with some new blackboards, which teacher and pupils appreciate.

Mrs. Carrie Beckett has resigned as teacher in District No. 11, and her sister, Miss Julia Forbes, has been employed for the remainder of the term.

We hope that the citizens of Heppner will not overlook the lectures this (Thursday) evening and tomorrow evening, at the Christian church. We wish to renew the invitation to all friends of education to visit the institute tomorrow and the school board convention on Saturday. The convention will be held at the Court House.
