ditions without some systematic co-operation on the part of the district boards.

If I have created enough interest in this subject, I would be glad to meet a committee of members from the various district boards and with the county superintendent with a view of perfecting such a system of rules and regulations.

A few things which probably the members of the district boards do not understand.
