**From Baseball to Religion.**

Rev. William Sunday, better known as "Billy" Sunday, the evangelist who is now conducting meetings in Spokane, Washington, devotes some of his meetings to men only and at one of these the other afternoon he told the story of his conversion while engaged as a baseball player in Chicago nearly a quarter of a century ago. It is somewhat interesting and is given in the following paragraphs:

Twenty-five years ago I stood on the corner of State and Van Buren streets in Chicago with a few other ball players, when there came along a little band of people playing and singing. We'd been in a lot of saloons and were pretty well tanked up. We stayed and listened and I heard the songs that I had heard as a boy and God portrayed on the curtain of my recollection the scenes of my childhood that I had heard as a boy at my mother's knee.

I turned to the other boys and said: "Boys, I bid you goodbye," and I followed the little band down the street to the old Pacific Garden mission. There I heard the story of Jesus and of his love and I staggered into the arms of Jesus Christ.

Four Sundays later I joined the Jefferson Park Presbyterian church. The girl with whom I was then keeping company, who is now my wife, belonged to that church. She had more influence with me than all the preachers in Chicago. Think! If she had been a Catholic I'd be a Catholic now.

Of course, it got into the papers that Billy Sunday, the member of the Chicago baseball team, had been converted. I had to go to practice every morning and I was afraid of the horse laugh that the fellows on the team would give me. I ate nothing for two days. I was so nervous, and I couldn't sleep.

I walked into the practice grounds and the first man that met me was old Mike Kelly. He gave me the glad hand and put his hand on my shoulder and said: "You know religion aint my longest, Bill, but if Kelly can do anything he'll be glad to do it."

Then I met Fred Pfeffer and all John Clarkson and the rest of the boys, and every one had a glad word for me and some encouragement.

That afternoon we played the old Detroit team for the championship. In the last half of the ninth inning the score stood 3 to 2 for us. Detroit was at bat. They had two men out and men on sec-

ond and third. Charley Bennett, their catcher, came to bat. He got two strikes and three balls. John Clarkson was pitching. I tell you John could swing 'em over. He could make 'em swing over the plate so fast the mercury would drop 2 degrees.

Charley Bennett could not hit floating balls. (I don't mean Scotch highballs; he could eat them up.) I balled him into John: "Keep 'em high and we've got him." John was leaning way over as he pitched the ball, and as he let it slip, I heard the hit. I could tell by the sound of the ball on the bat with in 10 yards of where it would field. I knew that ball was coming a long way back of me.

I could run in those days. I could run 100 yards in 16 seconds, and I started for where that ball was coming down. We didn't wear gloves then like you have in these days, and I stuck out my left hand and my fingers closed over the ball as it came whizzing down. The batter was out and the side retired and we won the game.

Mike Kelly was sold to Boston for \$10,000 and he got half of the purchase money. John L. Sullivan was at the height of his fame then and he took up a collection to buy Kelly a house worth \$10,000. I had to have him come to Boston. They took up subscriptions and gave him the money and he received the salary paid at that time for ball playing, but when he died he had spent his half of his purchase price; when he left Chicago to play with Boston he had spent the money people put in the bank for him and his house was mortgaged. They had to take up a subscription to help him. And Mike Kelly stood on the street corner with me 22 years ago when I said, "I bid you goodbye," and I staggered into the arms of Jesus.
