

### Oregon Building Completed.

Oregon was the first state to complete its building and the first to install exhibits at the Alaska-Yakon-Pacific exposition. Five months in advance of the opening of the exposition Oregon had two cars of choice apples and a car of forest products stored in its building and the entire exhibit will be installed two months before the gates of the exposition are opened.

The Oregon building is a handsome structure and occupies one of the best locations on the exposition grounds. It is just off the central court and overlooks Lake Washington. The building was completed in November and since that time the Oregon commission has been engaged in the assembling of the state exhibit.

By the early completion of its building Oregon has received a large share of the advertising during the pre exposition period. In the past three months more than 50,000 persons have paid admission to the exposition grounds.

The residence belonging to Mrs. Norton, occupied by Mrs. Parker, in Ione, was gutted by fire Sunday evening while Mrs. Parker was at church. The work of the Ione fire department was highly spoken of in checking the fire. There was no insurance on the building.

Bert Myers, aged 19 years, son of Mr. and Mrs. H. A. Myers, who reside near this city, died Monday evening of consumption. The funeral was conducted yesterday at Lexington. Rev. J. V. Crawford, of this city, preached the funeral sermon.
