Near Beer Resorts Will Hereafter Be Taxed

The city council met in regular session Monday evening with Mayor Farnsworth in the chair. Roll call showed a full board of councilmen present.

Ordinance No. 18 was passed. This ordinance provides for licensing and regulating all amusement places where near beer is sold or where cards, billiards and other games are played. Proprietors of these places must furnish a bond to keep orderly houses and a city license of \$25 per quarter will also be imposed.

The committee on fire and water was instructed to buy ladders to add to the equipment for fire protection.

The usual amount of bills were audited.
