### THIRD DISTRICT FAIR.

The success of the two former meetings of the Third District Fair at Pendleton, which embraces the counties of Umatilla and Morrow, has been the source of much encouragement to the officers and management.

Stimulated by the splendid meeting of last year the people in charge this year will exert more than usual effort in making the third meeting the best one yet held.

The fair this year will open September 27 and will close on October 2.

Four thousand dollars in cash will be distributed in premiums. This is strictly an agricultural society and the premiums go entirely for exhibits connected with agriculture solely for the benefit of agricultural interests.

The Pendleton fair will be of benefit to the farmers in the territory comprising the third district. It not only stimulates pride but impresses the importance of better methods in agriculture in order to grow better products of the farm. Better methods will mean not only better quality but larger yields and bigger prices which will add to the growth and prosperity of the country.

The meeting will bring the farmers together and help to unite interests in agricultural pursuits.

Considerable interest is being taken in the preparation of the exhibit from Morrow county. Last year we carried off a good share of the honors. This year we ought to do as well or even better. But it must be remembered that we have strong competition in the fertile lands of Umatilla. In order to make a good showing we must put on our Sunday clothes and get the best that we have. It is not wholly a matter of pride but a business proposition as well.

The State Fair at Salem is one of the pioneer institutions of Oregon. The coming meeting during the week of September 13-18, will be the forty-eighth annual one in the history of the organization. More improvements will be made this year than in any previous season. The main entrance will be constructed of concrete, flanked on either side by a commodious reinforced concrete administration building, in which will be located the offices of the board. The poultry pavilion and principal restaurants will be changed so as to take up less room affording larger lawns and more spacious walks up to and in front of the main exhibition buildings and the livestock barns.

The machinery and poultry pavilions have both been enlarged. The entries of agricultural products and livestock in their several classes will be more plentiful than ever. Owing to the big purses that will be hung up the racing program this year will be of great interest.
