Sheepmen Hold Lambs.

A. L. Bunnell and A. E. Harden, Klickitat sheepmen have returned to Goldendale from Glenwood where they looked after their flocks on the summer range in the Mt. Adams country. They report a number of buyers in the field for lambs and mutton sheep for the fall market. Buyers are offering to contract Spring lambs, on the range for \$3.50 with a 5 per cent cut. The sheepmen are not disposed to sell at this figure as the grass is good and their sheep are in excellent condition. Some of them expect to receive as high as \$4 without a cut for their lambs, but the ruling price will probably be \$3.75 to \$3.83, while choice lots of spring lambs may bring \$4. The output of Spring lambs and mutton from Klickitat county will be unusually large this year as weather conditions during the lambing season were very favorable and many growers will take advantage of the high prices offered and sell close. Sheep from the Mt. Adams Forest reserve are driven from Glenwood to Lyle and shipped from there to Portland and Seattle markets. A few years ago nearly all of the sheep from this territory were marketed at Troutdale but for the past two or three years Sound buyers have been unusually active in this field.

Power From the John Day

A company headed by H. V. Gates and taking in local and eastern capital has filed water rights on the John Day river, about twelve miles above Monument, for the purpose of constructing a power plant to supply Heppner with light and power.

The company has surveyed out a ditch and power site and filed rights on it and has also surveyed out a dam site where the river can be put over a fall of 70 feet. It is not likely that either project will be touched until next spring or summer, as Mr. Gates desires to travel in Mexico and other states, looking over different projects where dams are used. From either project a plant with a capacity of developing 2000 horsepower is to be installed, which will give Heppner and Morrow county plenty of power and light for some years to come.

Survivors of Civil War.

Salt Lake, Utah, Aug. 14.—The number of survivors of the civil war at the close of the last fiscal year, as shown by the report of the commissioner of pensions, was 620,985, according to the report of Grand Commander Nevius, before the encampment of the G. A. R. here. The number of survivors on the pension rolls May 31, 1909, was 596,411. The amount appropriated for pensions during the year was \$162,000,000.

Continuing he said: "It was impossible to give the numerical strength of the Grand Army on June 30, 1909, but on December 31, 1908, there were 220,616 members in good standing, 8539 having been suspended. During the year 1907, 10,124 members died and the total gains were 21,154 of whom 7434 were new members." He recommended a reduction in the number suspended.
