The Cossacks.

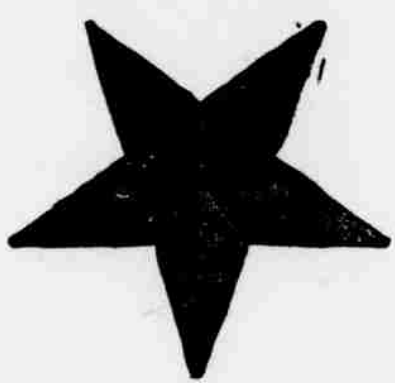
