In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Morrow County.

The First National Bank of Heppner, Oregon, a Corporation, Plaintiff, vs Jennie W. Matlock and H. J. Matlock, Defendants.

To Jennie W. Matlock and H. J. Matlock, the above named defendants:

In the Name of the State of Oregon, You and each of you are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit on or before six weeks from the 6th day of January, A. D. 1910, to-wit: On or before the 17th day of February, A. D. 1910, and if you fail to answer the plaintiff will apply to the court for the relief demanded in its complaint herein, namely, for judgment against you and each of you upon a certain promissory note in the sum of Five Thousand Dollars, (\$5000.00), dated May 8, 1903, with interest thereon at the rate of eight per cent per annum from said date, the sum of Four Hundred Dollars, (\$400.00), paid thereon May 12, 1904, Four Hundred Dollars, (\$400.00), paid thereon June 14 1905, Four Hundred Dollars, (\$400.00), paid thereon June 29, 1906, Four Hundred Dollars, (\$400.00), paid thereon June 10, 1907, and for the sum of Seven Hundred Thirty-three and 30-100 Dollars, (\$733.30), paid thereon March 10, 1909, and for the further sum of Five Hundred Dollars, (\$500.00), attorney's fees, and for plaintiff's costs and disbursements of this suit, and for a decree of this court for the foreclosure of two certain mortgages described in said complaint, securing the payment of said sums, and executed by the said defendants, being upon and covering the following described real property, to-wit: The Southwest Quarter of Section Thirty; the East Half of the Southwest Quarter and Lots three and four of Section Nineteen; the East Half of the Northwest Quarter and Lots one and two of Section Thirty-one in Township Two South of Range Twenty-seven.
