WOMEN IN QUEER PROFESSIONS.

New Fields Opened for the Enterprize of the Fair Sex.

The mere fact that women "do things" signifies that they have lost their old occupation, a fact which can not be concealed by the problems of bridge or the problems of Bridget, the Delinquent says.

The inventive faculty, commonly and properly supposed to be masculine, is most naturally directed to domestic advantage when possessed by a woman.
