Wool About all Sold.]

The second big wool sale under the sealed bid system, occurred here last Friday.

Prices ranged about the same as the first sale of last month, running from 11 1/2 to 17c per pound. Seven hundred and fifty thousand pounds of wool in the Heppner warehouse was practically all sold, averaging about 15 1/2c per pound.

About all of the wool in the Morrow Warehouse Milling Co's warehouse was sold, including about 750,000 pounds.

Jeff Jones secured the top price which was 17 cents per pound.

This practically cleans up all the wool in Morrow county this season.

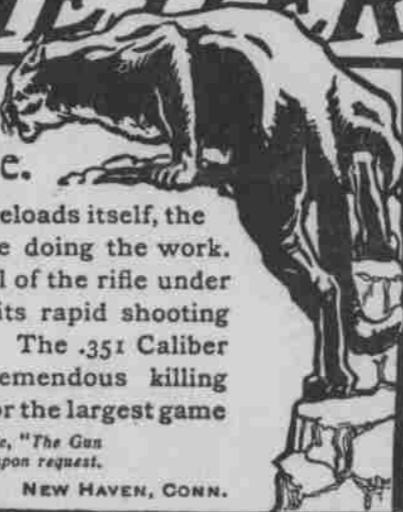
