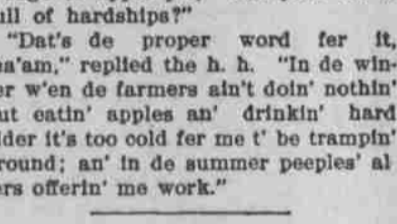
"No," answered the stranger, after sizing him up, "frankly speaking, I wouldn't."

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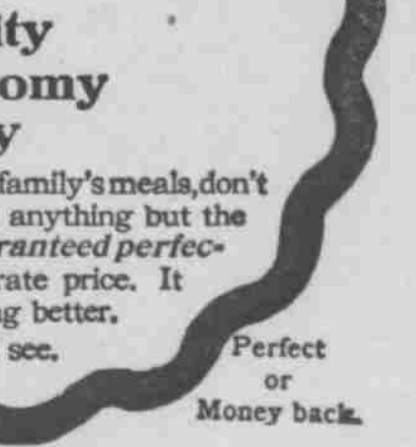
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
