In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for Morrow County. The First National Bank of Heppner, Oregon, a corporation, plaintiff, vs Elmer Stamp, B. P. Doherty, Edward McDaid and Ellen McDaid, defendants. To Elmer Stamp, B. B. Doherty, Edward McDaid and Ellen McDaid, the above named defendants:

In the name of the State of Oregon: You and each of you are hereby required to appear and answer the complaint filed against you in the above entitled suit on or before six weeks from the 29th day of September, 1910, to wit:
