RAILROAD MAN DECLARES FARMER IS NOT BENEFITED

Benjamin F. Yoakum, chairman of the Frisco lines, declares that neither the farmers nor the railroads are responsible for the high cost of living and that they are not the beneficiaries. He says it is up to the city people to devise some system whereby the tremendous costs and profits which lie between the producer and the consumer shall be eliminated. He says:

"A bushel of beans brings the Florida producer \$2.25. The 800-mile haul to New York by the railroads costs 50 cents. But the consumer pays \$6.40 for the bushel of beans. The producer receives 35 per cent., the transporter eight per cent., and the dealers 57 per cent.

"The average price for eggs paid to the farmers of Arkansas and Missouri is 15 cents. For the 1,300-mile haul to New York, including breakage, the railroads charge two cents. But the average cost of eggs to the consumer is 30 cents. In other words the men who receive these eggs in the morning in New York and deliver them, perhaps before night, charge 13 cents a dozen for their work.

"The rice farmers of Texas, Louisiana and Arkansas cannot sell their rice for more than 2½ cents a pound. The consumer in New York is paying ten cents a pound for rice. It costs to transport rice from Texas, Louisiana and Arkansas to New York one-half cent a pound. If the rice farmer were paid 3½ cents a pound and the dealer received one cent a pound, which is 25 per cent. profit, rice could be sold in New York at 20 pounds for a dollar. What I am trying to make clear is that the rice farmer could receive one cent a pound more for his rice and the consumer could get twice as much for the same money if through proper organization the product could go from the farm to the consumer, leaving one cent a pound to the dealer.

"According to Secretary Wilson, in 78 cities where the matter was investigated, the farmers receive less than 50 per cent. of what the consumers pay for milk, the railroads seven per cent. and the dealers 43 per cent.

"On articles of food for which the farmers receive \$274,289,000, the freight bill was \$25,045,000 and the expenses and profits of the middlemen were \$164,813,000. In other words, in addition to the freight, the expenses of handling and the profits were over 57 per cent.

"The problem is not one of trusts and tariffs, but of providing some system of getting food products from producer to consumer without so much expense and so many profits."

AGED SON OF MRS. EDDY BY HER FIRST MARRIAGE

A good deal of public interest was aroused as to whether the will of Mrs. Mary Baker G. Eddy, late head and founder of the Christian Science church, would be contested by her son, George Washington Glover, and other relatives. Mr. Glover was recently in Washington to consult ex-Senator Chandler, who was Glover's counsel in a suit instituted three years ago to test the competency of Mrs. Eddy to manage her affairs. He was accompanied by his daughter, Mary Baker Glover, and by Ebenezer J. Foster Eddy, Mrs. Eddy's adopted son.

George Washington Glover is the son of Mrs. Eddy by her first husband, who died in the south, and was reared by relatives, the condition of his mother at the time making it impossible for her to care for him. His home for many years has been in Lead, S. D.

In 1907 he, with other relatives of Mrs. Eddy, instituted suit to test the competency of the latter to administer her property. Various court hearings were held and a good deal of evidence was presented on both sides. Suddenly the suit was withdrawn and a little later a settlement was made, by the terms of which Mr. Glover and his family received \$245,000 and Ebenezer J. Foster Eddy \$45,000. In consideration of this Glover and his family and Mrs. Eddy's adopted son relinquished rights or expectant interests in Mrs. Eddy's estate and agreed not to contest or retard the probate of any will which Mrs. Eddy might leave.

New Wrinkle for Trouser.

"If you are your own valet," said a tailor—"and most men are—then let me tell you a valuable secret how to keep your trousers creased. One pressing a month, by this method, will do as much good as two pressings a week, old style.

"First, you must have a tiny tuck, not more than a sixteenth of an inch wide, made down the inside of the trousers, back and front, so as to hold the crease together. Then, for every pressing the trousers must be soaped inside.

"The soap, after the hot iron has done its work, makes the cloth as firm as iron. The tuck keeps the creases always bold and sharp. Result—a perfect trouser, the admiration of all beholders.
