Good Work.

Things have been moving some out at the Whetstone shearing plant. Twelve men are at work there, and on Monday they sheared out 2700 sheep, or an average of 230 to each man, and W. C. Sullivan, one of the crew, made a run of 334, which is considered a record breaker for Oregon, if not for the world. At ten cents per head this is a pretty good day's wages. The boys in this crew are getting to be record breakers, and the rapidity with which they work puts the old hand shearing method way in the shade and the work is also far superior since the men have learned to handle the machines.
