Secretary Thomas Fitz Gerald of the Third Eastern Oregon District Agricultural association has returned to Pendleton from Lehman Springs and is now "up to his neck" in work connected with the annual fair.

F. A. Sikes of Milton writes to Secretary Fitz Gerald stating his intention of working up the best exhibit ever sent from the east end of the county. He says M. T. Manele has been appointed to collect a large number of grain, grass and fruit samples for the display.

Secretary Fitz Gerald of the Morrow-Umatilla county fair, is being deluged with letters from attractions managers who want to come to Pendleton during the fair. The Oregon quartet is the most insistent of these and E. J. Arnold of carnival fame the most recent. All applications are being given consideration.

Henry M. Summers, the Hermiston director of the fair, is superintending the collection of what he declares will be the best exhibit ever sent to the annual Umatilla-Morrow county fair. A store room has been rented and is rapidly being filled.

County Commissioner H. M. Cookburn of Milton comes forward with the boast that he has the best field of oats in the county and he is preparing to prove his claim by collecting a sample to send to the fair.

Farmer Ogilvy of the Pilot Rock country is preparing what he declares will be the best individual display at the fair this year. He is credited with having gooseberries as large as hens' eggs and potatoes as big as footballs.

Good music is assured for the 1911 fair of the Third Eastern Oregon District Agricultural Society, a contract already having been signed with the Bowen band of Spokane to appear here during the week beginning Sept. 11. This band by general reputation is one of the best musical organizations in the northwest and the directors of the fair only closed the contract after thoroughly satisfying themselves of its qualifications. It is composed of twenty-five pieces under a capable director.

This band will give concerts in the pavilion every evening and during the afternoon of the first three days. During the latter three days, it will furnish music during the progress of the Round-up.
