

FOREST FIRES

State Forester Desires Prompt Reports.

The State Forester is constantly getting notice through the daily press and from residents of the State of fires having gotten beyond control after several days fighting, that have not been reported to his office until after becoming a menace to the neighborhood. He wishes to urge upon all State fire wardens the necessity of reporting to him all fires as soon after being discovered as possible, instead of waiting until they become dangerous to life and property. One such fire has just been brought to his notice after having burned three weeks, that might have been controlled and probably entirely extinguished if reported earlier so that proper assistance could have been given.

Every State fire warden, or other persons, in case they are unable to get in touch with a State warden, should telephone or telegraph (collect) F. A. Elliott, State Forester, Salem, Oregon, informing him of forest fires before they get beyond control.

Death of D. C. Ely.

David C. Ely passed from this life at Ione last Saturday morning. He had been sick for a period of about thirteen weeks, in fact ever since returning from his duties as Sargeant-at-Arms of the last session of the legislature in Salem. His sickness was the result of a series of complications the principal one of which was kidney trouble.

Funeral services were held at Ione on Sunday, conducted by Rev. Walter L. Airheart, of Heppner, and the remains were shipped to Portland Monday to be interred in the old soldiers' burying ground in that city.

Mr. Ely was a widower at the time of his death. He had been married twice and both his wives preceded him to the grave.

He was born in the state of Pennsylvania on August 21st, 1834, and was 76 years 11 months and 8 days old at the time of his death. Some two years ago he wrote a history of his life and this was read at the funeral. According to this history he followed school teaching for a number of years preceding the war of the rebellion. In June, 1861, he enlisted in the army and served as a sargeant and also as quartermaster general up to 1864, on account of failing health he was mustered out. Regaining his health to some extent, and not being content to remain out of the service, he again enlisted and organized a company of volunteers but before he could get into actual service he was again taken sick and had to abandon the idea of going to the front.

Mr. Ely came to Morrow county about twenty-five years ago, settling in the north end of the county, where he lived for several years. He then went to Stevens county, Washington and located at Colville, where he had a son residing. He was elected to the office of county auditor of Stevens county, serving one term, and lived in that county about ten years, after which he returned to Morrow county and located at Ione, where he has since resided.

He was married twice, and was father of one child by his first wife, which died in infancy. By his second wife there was born six children, four boys and two girls, and these "all survive, being Charles, of Colville, Wash., Hiram and George of Morgan, Fred, of Barton, Mamie, of Ione, and Sadie of Colville, Wash.

Mr. Ely was a very patriotic citizen and active in all political matters. He was a member of the G. A. R., and while confined to his bed at Ione he arranged for the proper observance of Memorial day on May 30th last, and took great interest in planning the details of that splendid program which he was not permitted to hear because of being too ill to leave the house. While he never aspired to any political office in this county, yet he always took an active part in the politics of the county, and during the last two sessions of the state legislature he ably performed the duties of sargeant-at-arms of that body. He was a good citizen, well respected by all his neighbors and had many friends here and elsewhere. During his long illness he was uncompromising and his passes on to a well earned reward.
