The campaign in behalf of Sherman, Gilliam and Morrow counties is to be pushed. A tri-county fair is to be held next October. There will be prizes for best vegetables, best grains, best hogs, best poultry and other products of husbandry. There will be effort all along the line to rehabilitate and repopulate the three counties.

Ex-representative Ginn, who spent nearly thirty successful years in the region, says rehabilitation of the farms and lands is easily possible. He says, if the average farmer will cultivate one third as much land as now and put on the one third, as much work as he now gives his present acres, there will be no question as to the outcome.

The small holdings, according to Mr. Ginn, have passed into the hands of large holders, and the farming is imperfectly done. This and an unusual period of successive dry years have brought about present conditions.

Thirty years' experience in the region makes the testimony of Mr. Ginn of value. It is distinct encouragement to the representatives of the three counties and Portland activities that met in Portland Monday and determined to push the campaign for solving the problems of the three counties.

I noted some samples of writing, which gave evidence of good movement.

Teachers who take the December examination for primary certificates will be expected to write a thesis upon one of the following subjects: Nature Study, Reading in the primary grades, or Busy Work.
