The cost per twenty pounds more "health" than they acre for spraying potatoes will be small compared to the advantage derived by H. L. ST. CLAIR of the farmers in increased yield and size

of the potatoes. The spraying substance should be nade by taking four pounds of blue stone and dissolving it in 25 gallons of water; add four pounds of lime with water enough to slack, and then add 25 gallons of water. Both blue stone and lime, when prepared, should be placed in separate barrels, then take a third barrel and pour in a bucket full of the blue stone and then a bucket full of the lime. This makes a perfect spray. The total cost will be 42 cents.

At the Cleveland potato patch certain rows will be sprayed two or three times, and some not at all, so that the amount necessary will be demonstrated

This amount will spray an acre twice, so that the cost will be about \$1 per
