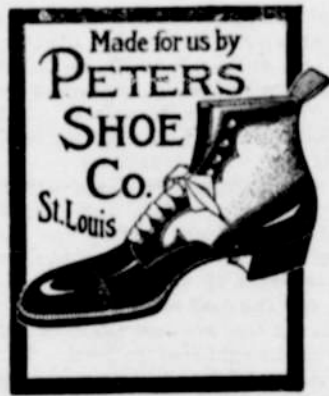
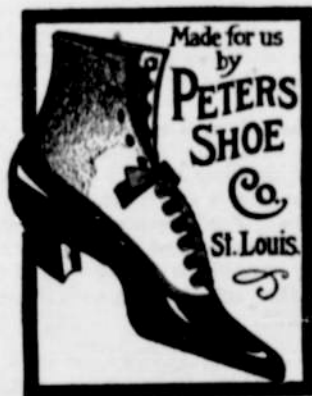

ORDINANCE 26.

AN ORDINANCE concerning offenses.

Be it ordained by the common council of the town of Gresham:

Section 1. That it shall hereafter be unlawful for any person or persons to disturb the peace and good order of the town of Gresham by any violent, riotous or disorderly conduct, or by the use of any profane, abusive or obscene language within the corporate limits of the said town, and upon conviction thereof the person or persons so offending shall be fined each in a sum of not less than two (2) dollars nor more than fifty (50) dollars or by imprisonment in the town jail not more than thirty (30) days or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 2. That it shall be unlawful for any person to drive an automobile, motor vehicle or motor cycle within the corporate limits of the town of Gresham, faster than a speed of eight (8) miles an hour where no crossings are, and four (4) miles an hour at crossings, and upon conviction thereof such person shall be fined in a sum not less than five (5) dollars nor more than fifty (50) dollars, or by imprisonment in the town jail not more than thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to in any way obstruct any street, sidewalk or public way within the corporate limits of the town of Gresham, and upon conviction thereof such person or persons shall be fined in a sum of not less than one (1) dollar each or more than ten (10) dollars each, or by imprisonment in the town jail not more than ten (10) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. That it shall be unlawful for any person to carry concealed about his person, in any manner whatsoever, any revolver or other firearm, or any knife (other than an ordinary pocket knife) or any dirk or dagger, slung shot or metal knuckles or any instrument by the use of which injury could be inflicted upon the person or property of any other person.

Any person violating the provisions of this section (4) shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten (10) dollars nor more than fifty (50) dollars, or by imprisonment in the town jail not less than five (5) days nor more than thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to any sheriff, constable, marshal, police or any other peace officer whose duty it is to serve process or make arrests.

Section 5. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to abuse or resist, within the corporate limits of the town of Gresham, any sheriff, constable, marshal, police, or any other peace officer while in the discharge of his duty, and upon conviction thereof such person or persons shall be fined each not less than five (5) dollars nor more than fifty (50) dollars, or by imprisonment not less than ten (10) days nor more than thirty (30) days in the town jail, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

ORDINANCE 27.

AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance 6, entitled "An ordinance licensing and regulating saloons in the town of Gresham."

Be it ordained by the common council of the town of Gresham:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Ordinance 6, entitled "An ordinance licensing and regulating saloons in the town of Gresham," be amended, and it is hereby so amended to read, "That each and every saloon or other place selling, dispensing or dealing in spirituous, vinous or malt liquors or fermented cider, commonly called hard cider, within the town of Gresham, shall first obtain a license from the common council of the town of Gresham, and failure to obtain such license shall be considered an offense and shall be punished by a fine of not more than fifty (50) dollars.
