M. P. Evans Has Narrow Escape

"Mack" Evans, who drives a delivery wagon for the Dwight Edwards Coffee Co., had a narrow escape from death under the wheels of a streetcar on Thursday afternoon of last week. He was driving on the car track on Grand avenue, near Madison street, when a streetcar came crashing into the wagon from behind. Mr. Evans had no warning of the impending danger, and claims that the motorman in charge did not even ring his bell. The wagon was upset and, together with the horse and driver, was pushed nearly half a block before the car was stopped. The horse was pretty badly used up and Mr. Evans received injuries to his back, and other bruises that still confine him to his bed. It is understood that a representative of the streetcar company called and offered to pay all doctor bills and give him \$100 beside in settlement, but Mr. Evans prefers to await developments of the extent of his injuries before accepting any terms.
