Harriman Must Pay High.

D. S. Dunbar has been acting as juror in the circuit court now in session in Portland, and one of the principal cases which he served on was a case between the Love estate and the Harriman lines, to determine what amount the Harriman lines should pay the Love estate for running the St. Johns to Troutdale branch across one corner of the estate. The estate wanted \$33,000 to allow the Harriman line to lay less than a mile of rails on their grounds. This looked too much out of proportion to Mr. Harriman and naturally it was left to the court to decide. The line will undoubtedly be very expensive for the Harriman system on account of the fact that it will touch nearly all of the principal farms between St. Johns and Troutdale.

League to Leave Matter Rest, for While at Least.

The League held its regular meeting last Monday evening and various matters of importance were brought up and discussed. The committee appointed to interview the electric and gas companies in regard to light facilities reported that they had not been able to get an audience with either President Fuller of the electric company, or Manager Papst of the gas company, and recommended that communication be addressed to these gentlemen, setting forth our wishes and asking what promises for the future in the matter of electric light and gas could be given.

The fact that a remonstrance against the proposed improvement of Hibbard street had been circulated and presented to the council was reported. Dr. Deveny, an owner of property on that street, was present and urged that as the League had taken up the matter and had circulated the petition asking for the improvement, that it follow up the good work by appointing a committee to see the street committee of the council. The doctor said that he was very much in favor of improving the street and desired that everything possible be done to forward it. A committee consisting of Epton, Carter and Dr. Deveny was appointed to take the matter in hand.

The fact that the Board of Trade had joined hands with the Center Addition Protective Association and had defeated the widening of Villa avenue, for the present at least, was brought up, and while some of the members were desirous of making a further fight the majority were of the opinion that the League had done everything that could reasonably be asked of it, and could rest content to let the blame of the failure rest where it belongs.
