Chas. Hyle Returns From Trip East

Chas. Hyle has returned from an extended broom corn purchasing trip which carried him through nearly all the states of the Northwest. He reports having had a very successful trip, and being astonished at the general prosperity which he found in all sections visited. In Oklahoma the crop of broom corn amounted to 40,000 tons, and of this about 30,000 tons were damaged by the heavy rains which fell in that section. This is not a total loss, however, but makes an inferior quality. Mr. Hyle brought home specimens of broom corn from Illinois and also from the Snake river country, in Oregon and Washington, and said that the two would compare very favorably to the Oregon corn, except that our people had not yet acquired the knack of giving it the proper treatment. Once this difficulty is overcome Mr. Hyle says there is no reason that we should not be able to compete with any country on earth.

Montavilla Has Up-to-Date Hotel.

Montavilla's new hotel on Hibbard street near the end of the carline is one of the improvements Montavilla should be proud of, and under the skillful direction of Mrs. A. E. Herman the cuisine is all that could be desired.

The building contains 23 rooms, 13 of which are sleeping apartments and each room is supplied with new up-to-date furnishings. The parlor, which occupies the whole front section on the second floor, is supplied with a beautiful piano in addition to the sofas and easy chairs, which make the place one of comfort and a good place to rest.

The large dining room, capable of accommodating 30 or more guests, is a model of convenience, and the kitchen, which is supplied with all the necessary apparatus for the highest cuisine art, is most conveniently arranged, making it a pleasure for those who care for that department. Since taking possession, Oct. 17th, Mrs. Herman has found the business increasing so rapidly that the building is already found to be too small and an addition in the near future is contemplated.
