J. ACKERMAN VISITS ASSOCIATION

Ladies Take Much Interest in Home Training Association.

The regular bi-monthly meeting of the Home Training Association of Montavilla held at the public school building last Friday afternoon was well attended and thoroughly enjoyed by all present. Quite a number of new faces were to be noted at the gathering, indicating a growing interest in the work of the association. The speaker of the day was Hon. J. H. Ackerman, state superintendent of public instruction, and his subject was "Home and the Public Schools." His discourse took more of the nature of a talk than a lecture, as he presented the relations of the home to the schools and the schools to the home.

Mr. Ackerman set forth plainly the fact that each had responsibilities that could not be shirked without the danger of material injury to the child. The school must have the aid of the home in building character as the latter has the custody of the child for the larger part of the time. The mother should know the whereabouts and occupation of the child at all times when not in school and should see to it that it is kept free from all demoralizing influences and association.

He urged the closest intimacy between the mothers and teachers as by this means a fuller knowledge of the child's requirements could be gained and its upbuilding, intellectually and morally, placed on a firmer basis. In closing, Mr. Ackerman paid a high tribute to the Montavilla association and its work.

At the close of the meeting the president, Mrs. H. B. Dickinson, invited the ladies present to meet at her home on the following Wednesday afternoon to take steps toward organizing a reading club.

The next meeting will be held on Friday, Nov. 23d, at which time Rev. Gilman Parker will talk on "Moral and Social Training of Children."

Belgian Hare Flesh For Fowls.

Nothing is so good for a meat food for fowls and growing chicks as Belgian hare. Boll thoroughly and when dry run through a meat grinder. Nothing in the world can equal this food for winter egg getting. Five does and a buck will supply the needs of a good sized poultry plant.

Colds In Fowls.

To cure a severe cold in a fowl, begin treatment with a dose of epsom salts, twenty to thirty grains. For any swelling around the eyes apply melted lard to which has been added a small quantity of kerosene oil. Also give the bird a teaspoonful of this mixture twice a day.
