Bartlett & Palmer have disposed of their holdings in the Western Importing Co. and have opened up real estate offices in the Lafayette building.

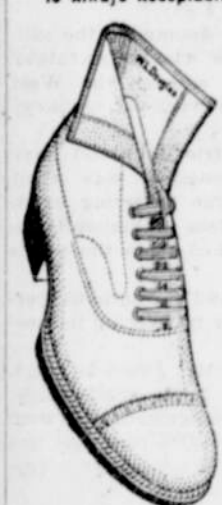
