ORDINANCE 29.

AN ORDINANCE appropriating money out of the general fund for street improvement work.

Be it ordained by the common council of the town of Gresham:

Section 1. That the sum of ten and forty-hundredths (10.40) dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated out of the general fund of the town of Gresham for the payment of the claims of Henry Kane for labor performed on Fourth street in Mt. Hood addition in the town of Gresham.

ORDINANCE 30.

AN ORDINANCE declaring a surplus in the fund raised by special assessment for street improvement work and authorizing a refund to certain persons of the same.

Be it ordained by the common council of the town of Gresham:

Section 1. That there is now in the fund raised by special assessment for street improvement work a surplusage of twenty five (25) dollars after all indebtedness has been fully met and paid.

Section 2. That there be refunded and appropriated and then hereby appropriated out of said special fund to the persons named herewith the amounts specified to each as follows, viz:

Section 3. That the Recorder be and he is hereby authorized to draw the warrants of the town against the special fund for street improvement for the several amounts as specified in section 2 of this ordinance and deliver the same to the persons in whose favor drawn.
