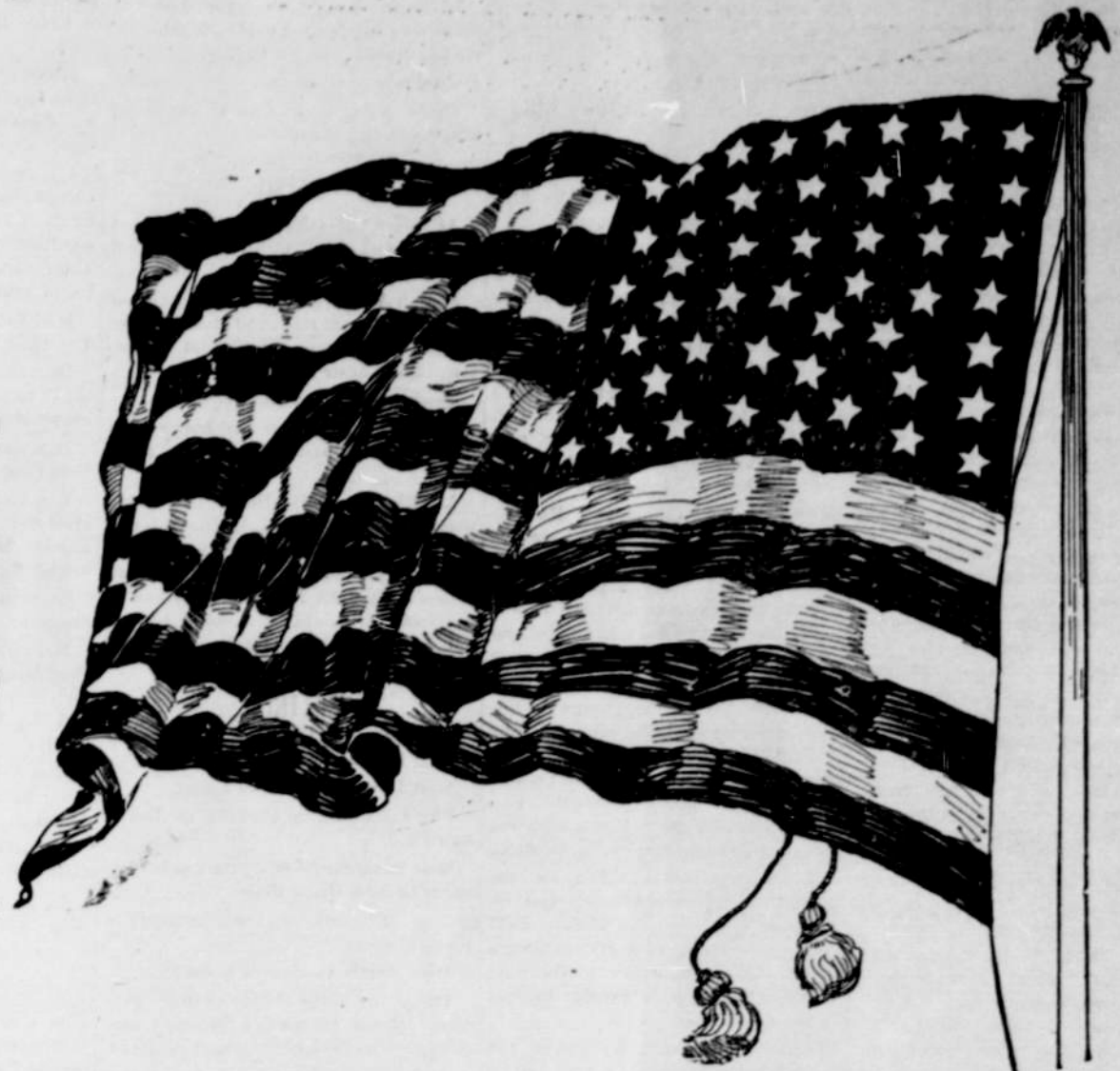


THE EAGLE WILL SCREAM

After this will come citizens' single turnouts, Gresham's big brass band under the direction of Prof. Fred Fieldhouse, business men's floats, Gresham's fire department, baseball teams, clowns and citizens' mounted cavalcade, etc.
