DIVISION C—SHEEP. Each breed to be shown separately. Lincoln, Cotswold, Shropshire, Southdown, Oxford, Merino. All to be registered. Best ram, 2 years and over, 1st and 2nd premium.

DIVISION D—HOGS. Each breed to be shown separately. Poland China, Berkshire, Essex, Chester White. All to be registered. Best boar over 2 years old, 1st and 2nd premium.

Best boar over 1 year and under 2 years, 1st and 2nd premium. Best sow over 2 years old, 1st and 2nd premium. Best sow over 1 year and under 2 years, 1st and 2nd premium.

DIVISION E—VEGETABLES. H. E. DAVIS, in charge. Roots must be washed clean and all displays must be free from insect pests and rot.

DIVISION F—GRAIN AND SEEDS. Every article must be entered in the name of the grower, whose number must be entered on the entry tag.

DIVISION G—FRUITS. For best plate of Baldwin apples, size and freedom from blemishes considered, 5 Baldwin trees, donated by the Eastwood nurseries.

On motion, it was resolved, that a committee of three be appointed to draft such rules and regulations as the society may require for a full and perfect organization, to be reported to the first adjourned meeting of this society.

At this meeting, by-laws were adopted, and \$3.00 was fixed as the annual membership fee and A. C. Gibbs, James B. Stephens and A. G. Walling were elected delegates to the convention to be held at Salem on Feb. 22, 1890, for the purpose of organizing a State Agricultural society.

At the second semi-annual meeting, held July 7, 1890, an address—the first one delivered before the society—was given by Judge Geo. H. Williams.

“One word as to the agricultural prospects of Oregon: Many are disposed to borrow trouble on this point. ‘When will our lands increase in value?’ asks one; and ‘where will be our market?’ asks another. You have a market, and it will continue. Your surplus will find a sale as water finds a level.

At this meeting of the society the annual dues were reduced from \$3 to \$1. And further, owing to ‘the indifference of the people of Portland’ the constitution was amended so as to empower the executive committee to place it at the point offering the ‘greatest inducements.’
