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

Gossip-mongering sheets are singularly devoid of information touching this Spanish exponent of the strenuous life. Such is outwardly the man who has achieved lately international fame and who seems destined to take rank with the great makers of history.

At twenty-five, the district of Soria sent him to the Cortes, where he took his seat among the advanced liberals. During the ephemeral republic, after the resignation of King Amadeo of Savoy, he called to the sub-secretary ship of the presidency, a position of importance which, however, almost blighted his prospects; the right-hand man of the chief magistrate, he had to bear the blame for many republican measures, the carrying out of which was intrusted to him.

For many years after, although he had been minister of finance and justice in several cabinets, he was not welcome at the royal palace. His name was too closely linked with the overthrow of the monarchial regime.

In 1902, invited by Premier Sagasta these beautiful mountains. 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
