The best hay feeds for dairy cows are clover, alfalfa, cowpeas and soy beans. They contain a large percent of protein, which is a great milk producing element.

What is the most promising branch of farming today?

Dairy farming, for it brings in a steady flow of money and greatly increases the production of the farm every year.

Where should the dairyman look for his feed supply?

He should look to his own fields. All dairy feeds should be grown on the farm, unless it is a little concentrated feed.
