THE Kellogg Toasted Corn Flake Company is in trouble and its attorneys are seeking the public's sympathy. The Government claims the Kellogg plan of handling goods, which by the way, is identical with that of hundreds of other big concerns, namely dictating the selling price to local retailers is illegal. The Kellogg people say a manufac turer has the right to dic-tate how his goods shall be sold. We do not suppose the Government will make any objection to that. That is, or should be, the end of the manufacturer's authority when he has sold his goods to the jobber, or retailer and has the cash or contract or note for the cash, he should be considered as being eliminated from furthbr dictation. At least that is the Governments contention. 
